## Next stages with developing the JSNA

Welcome to the next edition of the JSNA newsletter, which will continue to update you on developments. As a key role for the Health and Wellbeing Board, there is further consideration being given to style and content of our online JSNA which may result in further developments. These will be reported in a later edition of the newsletter. In the meantime, we have produced some new products in the last few months.



**ELECTORAL DIVISION PROFILES:** A set of health and wellbeing profiles for each of the 84 Electoral Divisions in Norfolk were published in July 2012, to set out some key information of the health and wellbeing of residents in each area. These have now been updated for the new members of the County Council, and have given them a useful summary of issues in their areas, with links to where more detailed information can be found. **MORE 2011 CENSUS DATA RELEASED:** Over the past six months, we have been updating and publishing a wide range of data released from the Office for National Statistics (ONS) on findings from the 2011 Census. The more recent releases have allowed us to publish some of the data at lower geographic levels (below District level) and aggregate the findings to other key geographies, such as CCG level, children centre areas and Police Safer Neighbourhood Team levels. **PUBLIC VOICE:** As part of the JSNA, we have developed the Public Voice section to allow the findings of useful and relevant surveys to be made available. The most recent updates to Public Voice are on the 'Links to Health and Wellbeing Consultations and Research' which has been rewritten to include fresh opportunities. ## Norfolk's Child Poverty Needs Assessment – May 2013

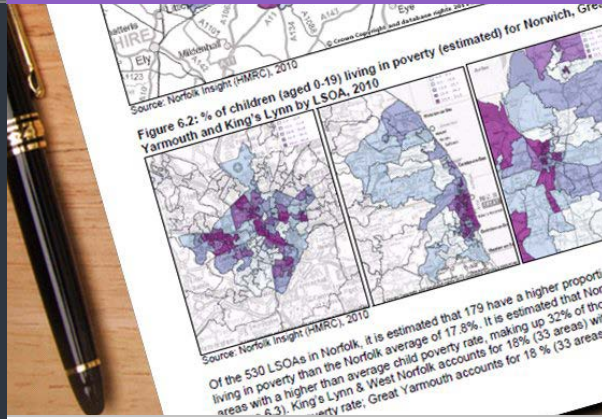
Norfolk's Child Poverty Needs Assessment gives a picture of the extent and reasons for child poverty in Norfolk and suggests where there are issues that need to be addressed. We know that where children grow up in poverty, they suffer from a range of disadvantages including poorer health, less economic opportunity and a higher likelihood of becoming a victim of crime.

The key findings of this assessment set out where Norfolk's young people appear to suffer disadvantage and suggests areas where the wider partnership of agencies and organisations in Norfolk need to work together to improve the situation.

**AGE AND STAGE PROFILES:** Following discussions with the Children Services team at County Hall, it was agreed to develop two full Age and Stage Profiles for Children and Young People in Norfolk. They cover children and young people of 0-10 years, and 11-19 years, and have now been published on Norfolk Insight as part of the JSNA.

It was agreed to amend the 'categorisation' of children and young people's domains into:

- Population
- Education and learning
- Health needs
- Economic needs
- Family related issues
- Community related issues

Information was collected and presented in the profiles for both age groups and where possible disaggregated to District Council level. The profiles provide a consistent evidence base that can now be used by a range of service commissioners and providers to focus on the assessed needs of children and young people. The profiles will be updated on an annual basis.
